Rot in Hell

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NOTE: The voices of the ZEALOT and the MAN should be quite distinct, so the last voice-over is recognizable.

ONE:

Split screen:

On the left: A collage of images showing both the public nature of religion and the enthusiasm of those who proselytize:

- exterior view of churches of all kinds
- tv evangelists
- door-to-door Jehovah's Witnesses
- Gideon Bibles in hotel rooms
- billboards saying "Repent Jesus will save you!" or some such
- prayer being said in school and town council meetings
- nativity scenes in public places

On the right: Ordinary people going about their lives

TWO:

On the left side of a no-longer split screen, a ZEALOT stands on a soapbox on a street corner; he is in mid-rant.

ZEALOT

And He will forgive you, yes He will. God loves you, and He knows you, He knows everything and with Him all things are possible. He -

An ordinary MAN walks toward him from the right, sets his own soapbox onto the sidewalk about ten feet away, and stands on it.

MAN

How do you know that?

ZEALOT

(welcoming the chance to dialogue and convert yet another poor sinner)

Why, the Bible tells me so!

He raises his Bible.

ZEALOT (CONT'D)

"With God all things are possible." Matthew 19:26.

MAN

And yet he couldn't drive out the people in that valley because they had chariots of iron. Judges 1:19.

ZEALOT

(getting angry)

You are trying to anger me, but I will not be angered. I follow in my Lord's footsteps and offer love and peace.

(turning to the people presumably listening to

him)

John 14:27. "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you" saith the Lord.

MAN

Except when he said "I came not to send peace, but a sword."
Matthew 10:34.

ZEALOT

(barely
containing his
anger; his
words
contradict his
demeanor)

I see you are a man without faith. I urge you to look into your heart. I know in my heart there's a god.

MAN

Well, I know in my head -

ZEALOT

(losing it)
You will rot in Hell, sir.
 (in a
 threatening
 tone)

I know.

MAN

Right then. And why should I believe you? I mean, you can't just stand there and say whatever you want without anything to back it up. Well, you can, but why would anyone believe you? Do you have some expertise in the area of - epistemology and the supernatural?

ZEALOT

I speak for God.

MAN

Ah. Do you have an affadavit or something from God authorizing you to speak on his behalf?

ZEALOT

I am a minister of the Lord, I have been chosen -

Yes, yes, but how do I know you've been chosen - you could be -

ZEALOT

He speaks to me!!

MAN

Could be a brain tumour.
Happens, you know. Auditory
hallucinations.

ZEALOT

You are a sinner, sir, and you will rot in Hell!

MAN

Yes, you keep saying that, but all I'm after is a little evidence, some proof -

ZEALOT

I have all the evidence I need, sir. Right here.

He holds his Bible aloft.

MAN

A book? That's it? Wait, I've got a book too.

He pulls a book out of his pocket; no title is visible; he hastily scribbles something on a piece of paper he also pulls out of his pocket, then puts the sheet of paper inside the book.

MAN (CONT'D)

Look!

(he opens the
 book and reads)
It says "There's a Great Big
Pig in the sky - with diamonds"
- and, um, it's "making a list"
-

ZEALOT

You just put that in there. I saw you. You wrote it yourself. What is written by the hand of men is fallible and

But all the books in the Bible were written by the hands of men. Primitive men. Men who had practically just discovered fire. And things were put in, or taken out, all the time. For example, in 1880, the American Bible Society decided to cut 14 whole books from the King James Version.

ZEALOT

It is heathens like you, sir, that brought the Katrina upon us. And the Tsunami. And all the plagues and pestilence of the Earth.

MAN

All my fault? Those people died because God was mad at me?! Not very fair, your god.

ZEALOT

How dare you question the ways of the Lord! He is omniscient, he is omnipotent, he is beneficent -

MAN

Well, he can't be all three. Babies are being tortured and he doesn't stop it. So either he doesn't know about it or he doesn't want to stop it or he can't.

Beat.

MAN (CONT'D)

Or he doesn't exist.

ZEALOT

Then who created you? Who created the Earth, the Universe? Everything needs a creator!

Well if everything needs a creator, then who created God?

ZEALOT

He always was.

MAN

Then why couldn't the universe have always been?

ZEALOT

(ignoring that
and carrying
right on)

My son, of course God exists! God is everywhere!

MAN

Where exactly? I'd like to see him.

ZEALOT

His presence is everywhere.

MAN

Okay. I'd like to feel him. His presence.

ZEALOT

Open your heart -

MAN

(losing
 patience)
Open your mind!

Beat.

MAN (CONT'D)

There is no evidence he exists!

ZEALOT

Evidence? You want evidence? Look around you, how the sun nourishes the flowers, how the animals provide for us. Everything on this beautiful earth shows his hand, his divine design, it fits together like -

Oh please. Anything that didn't fit died. Became extinct.

ZEALOT

(his turn to become angry, again)

Repent! Else you will rot in Hell!

MAN

Yeah, you keep saying that. But if Hell is a place of eternal flame, things wouldn't rot so much as burn. 'Course I guess with god all things are possible.

FADE OUT

POLICE OFFICER (V.O.) Come with us sir, You're under arrest, breach of the peace and disorderly conduct...

MAN (V.O.)
Me? You're taking me in?
